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### 1. *The Malahat Review's* Summer 2007 issue is in the mail and on the newsstands

This issue has legs! The cover photo, titled *Relay*, of zebra legs in taxidermy, is by Aurian Haller. Haller is this year's co-winner of our Long Poem Prize for his "Song of the Taxidermist." Harold Rhenisch's "The Bone Yard" was also selected by judges Brian Bartlett, Margo Button, and John Pass. Both long poems are featured in this issue. The judges also singled out three others (from a total of 173 entries) as finalists: Beth D. Cote (for "Near North"), Michael Lista (for "Anatomy of Heavy Things"), and Michael Reynolds (for "Artefact: A Sonnet Fugue"). Issue 159 also contains wonderful poems by Richard Lemm, Adam Sol, Helen Humphreys, Karen Hofmann, and Timothy Liu. The short fiction content leads off with "Letters to Sunday" by Stephen Marche, a story that explores a fine line between friendship and obsession. Riel Nason's story "The Box" captures perfectly one guest's feelings of alienation at a wedding reception where conformity is expected. "Aftermath" by Peter Gilmour is a sensitive and thought-provoking account of a rape victim's steps towards emotional recovery. Run—don't walk— to get your copy of our summer issue!
